The learning experience will be enhanced through discussion of storytelling technique, analysis of scenes from classic films and supplemental reading. No technical skills or prior experience necessary.

All you need are the means to capture video (camera or phone) and to edit it (dedicated or free editing software such as Premiere, iMovie, VSDC, etc.)

Description: This course is an applied oral history and digital storytelling bootcamp-style training in tools and tactics for conducting oral history interviews and developing digital archives and public-facing projects. The first day is a survey of oral history theory-close reading literature on oral history's potential as a methodology for social justice and community organizing. The second day introductes international best practices for doing oral history in a digital era, highlighting how the digital age complicates informed consent, with a tactical training in the Abbreviated Life Story Model and time for practicing through a series of interviews focused on the Antioch experience. The final day of the workshop is dedicated to learning how to work with open source tool for digit exhibit building, including the Oral Histories Metadata Synchronizer and other digital storytelling tools such as Timeline JS and Story Maps.

Description: This block course introduces students to landmark cases in modern Supreme Court history, with focus on decisons which had significant impact on the political landscape of the United States: Brown v. Board of Education; Roe v. Wade; Miranda v. Arizona; Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission; Distrist of Columbia v. Heller; Shelby County v. Holder, etc. Students will be required to read full majority opinions, concurrences and disserts and to gain familiarity with the workings of the Court and its power dynamics from the Warren Court to the present. Students will also be expected to gain an in depth understanding of the political, legal, and social issues at stake in each landmark case, and, through supplementary reading, will gain a grounding in critical legal theory.
