<p><b>Description:</b> The slogan "democratic socialism" has been revived in American political rhetoric, but its meaning and implications need clarification. It evokes theories, movements and regimes from the past that provide both inspiration and circumspection for the future. This course reviews democratic socialist theories with an emphasis on the work of H.G. Wells. It reviews nineteenth and twentieth century experiments with intentional communities and reviews the British experience with democratic socialism beginning in 1945. <p><b>Description:</b> The course will provide students with an introduction to the American legal system and its interrelation with society. Students will learn the structure of the American legal system and the basic analytical framework applied by courts to legal disputes. The course will cover the basic procedures used in litigation, including complaints, discovery and motions, and basic legal research skills. The substantive areas will include subject areas of the common law: torts, contracts and evidence in the state court systems. In the federal system, the students will learn the framework for analysis of constitutional issues such as federal jurisdiction, freedom of speech, protection of religious liberty, due process of law, equal protection, limitations on police use of force, takings of property, zoning, labor and employment law. The course materials will primarily be decisions in specific legal cases which will also demonstrate the impact of the law on major social and political issues. The one or more of the substantive areas may be changed at the time the course is given. Prerequisite: None. Registration open to any and all Antioch students; students from other colleges; Antioch faculty/staff, local community members.</p>

<p><b>Description:</b> This course is designed along the lines of a workshop with the intention of examining historical models of community governance at Antioch College up to the closure and forward to the present day. Because of the workshop nature of this course, the final desired outcome of this work is to create a set of recommendations that lead to a restructuring of community governance at this institution. Participants should include current students, staff, faculty and administrators as well as past community members who have an ongoing interest in the formation of a governance system that aligns with the mission of the institution as well as pays tribute to the effective outcomes of historical models of governance that existed prior to the closing in 2008.</p>

<p><b>Description:</b> This course is an applied oral history and digital storytelling bootcamp-style training in tools and tactics for conducting oral history interviews and developing digital archives and public-facing projects. Students who register for this course will be attending a week-long institute with other students and faculty from across the GLCA. A full agenda with details on each session and working meals in the Antioch Kitchens will be distributed before the course begins. The workshop begins with a survey of oral history theory-close reading literature on oral history's potential as a methodology for social justice and community organizing. Students will be introduced to international best practices for doing oral history in a digital era, highlighting how the digital age complicates informed consent, with tactical training in the Abbreviated Life Story Model and time for practicing through a series of interviews focused on the Antioch experience. The final day of the workshop is dedicated to learning how to work with open source tool for digital exhibit building, including the Oral Histories Metadata Synchronizer and other digital storytelling tools such as Timeline JS and Story Maps.</p>
