Born in Brooklyn, New York on August 30, 1938, Robert (Bob) S. Fogarty was an American Studies scholar at Antioch College for more than five decades. Bob earned his degrees at Fordham University (B.S., 1960) and University of Denver (M.A., 1962, Ph.D., 1968). He was a specialist in the study of American communal and utopian studies. Among his publications were *Dictionary of American Communal and Utopian Studies*, *The Righteous Remnant: The House of David*, and *All Things New: American Communes and Utopian Movements, 1860-1914*. He

taught courses in American history and literature. One of his more popular courses was “American Autobiography.” He also held visiting lectureships in China and South Korea and he was a visiting Fellow at All Souls College, Oxford University. For forty years, he was editor of the prize winning *The Antioch Review*. Upon his retirement, Antioch College named him the John Dewey Professor in the Humanities, Emeritus, and he was awarded the J.D. Dawson award for significant contributions to the College in 2019. He was an elected Fellow of the Massachusetts Historical Society. Professor Fogarty died on August 9, 2021 in Yellow Springs, Ohio.
