Kelsey is a fully licensed professional counselor with primary responsibilities being oversight of the department and department staff. While she does not offer individual counsleing sessions to students, she does meet with students to provide supports that other staff are currently unable to offer such as formal diagnoses and letters to support students in obtaining emotional support animal housing accommodations.

What is Counseling?

Counseling is meeting with a licensed mental health professional (i.e. counselor) to work on building positive thinking processes and coping mechanisms to manage problems. Therapy can be used to address and treat mental illness, but not everyone who could benefit from therapy has a mental health diagnosis. Therapy can help with a variety of everyday problems and understandings oneself better.



Mental Helath Supports

Antioch currently has grant funds to support two key projects:

1) Students can access <u>free mental health assessments for ADHD, Autism, and Learning Disabilities</u>. This is a joint project between Counseling Services and Student Success departments. 2) Students have access to <u>three free virtual sessions with a psychiatrist</u> through Brightside Psychiatry. To be referred speak with any Antioch counselor.

5 Levels of Care

There are 5 levels of mental health and substance abuse treatment, ordered from lowest to highest:

- 1. Outpatient (OPT): Meeting with a therapist or psychiatrist on a regular basis.
- 2. Intensive outpatient (IOP): Treatment requires more time and attention than outpatient, but does not require living in a facility.
- 3. Partial hospitalization (PHP): Often referred to as a day program or treatment, patients come to the facility daily or near daily for multiple hours per visit.
- 4. Residential: For stable patients who still need support for recovery. Patients live at the facility.
- 5. Inpatient: Provides stabilization after an acute emergency or crisis (e.g. suicide attempt or overdose), with the goal of transitioning the patient to a lower level of care once stable.
